#### **Coastal Bend Food Bank**



Our December, 2021 Communion offering will go to the **Coastal Bend Food Bank**, a 501© (3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to reduce hunger in South Texas through food distribution and nutrition education. Since 1982 it has provided food and aid to a network of more than 144 agencies such as food pantries, shelters, senior centers and feeding agencies in 11 counties throughout South Texas. The Coastal Bend Food Bank (CBFB) is a large warehouse that collects perishable and non-perishable foods that otherwise might go to waste from local and regional producers, growers, distributors and retailers, and distributes it via a refrigerated truck to 55 sites



(charities and service agencies) in the 11 county area. The CBFB is more than just a food warehouse, though,

as folks who need aid may receive, in addition

to food, help with applying for benefits from the Health and Human Service Commission of Texas, such as Food Stamps, Adult and Children's Medicaid, Children's Health Care Program (CHIPS), Women's healthcare Program,

and Long-term Care for Seniors. The CBFB also operates a food-for-local-distribution facility located in the Nutrition Education building on



its campus. This pantry was developed as a "shopping model" where participants select their own food instead of receiving a bag of preselected items, which offers clients a more dignified and educational approach to food selection. In 2019, the CBFB reached 980,000 people across 11 counties and partnered with 105 food distribution sites that dispensed over 13 million pounds of food!

The Coastal Bend Food Bank operates a number of other successful programs including: a *Kid's Backpack program*, which provides kids identified by their school as food-insecure with backpacks full of nutritious, child-friendly food the day before weekends or holiday periods; a

of a big refrigerated truck, and provides them with food and fresh produce every month;

Nutrition Education classes for kids and adults with hands-on cooking classes, lectures and games to help inspire healthy eating and healthilifestyles: Diabetes Hands-on Self-Management classes with an introduction to nutrition, monitoring blood glucose, understanding insulin, exercise, and preventing complications. Other programs include an Outreach Program, which goes into rural areas having few services and assists clients with applications for various services; a Kid's Cafe, which helps kids from low income families with homework, tutoring, reading, music and life skills, as well as hot meals and snacks; and a Teen Table, in which CBFB and the CCISD partner to provide homeless teens without adult supervision with 2 weeks of food as well as clothing, school supplies and connections to community resources to improve the quality of their lives.

The dedicated staff, led by Executive Director Beatriz (Bea) Hanson (no stranger to our local TV stations whenever our Food Pantry makes the news), includes several RN's for general nutrition and diabetes education, a Human Resources generalist, Social Services folks, and many others involved with procuring, storing, sorting, labeling and distributing the donated food and other items. With the Christmas Season now upon us and being a time of not only joy at the birth of our Savior, but also a time when many less fortunate folks really need help, please open your hearts and wallets to help keep our Food Bank able to assist as many needy people as possible.


